QUESTION 1

Suppose you are a member of an interfaith organisation, such as the World Council for Religion and Peace (WCRP). You are being interviewed by an international news channel. Write your responses to the following questions:

- 1.1 Do you think interreligious cooperation is necessary today? Give reasons for your response. (10)
- 1.2 Elaborate on two examples where interreligious cooperation has worked in South Africa or Africa. (10)
- 1.3 What role has the African Traditional Religion (ATR) played in interreligious dialogue in Africa, and what role do you see for it to play in the future? (10)
- 1.4 What, do you think, will be the future roles of interreligious organisations? (10)
- 1.5 Islam is seen by many as a rapidly growing religion in the West. What impact will this have on organisations such as the WCRP? (10)

- 2.2 Give an example of at least ONE religious organisation and state how it helps to overcome poverty. (14)
- 2.3 Identify ONE other social problem (besides poverty) and state what religious organisations can do to address it. (16)
