EMBRACING ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE

- The words artificial intelligence (AI) seem to be on the tip of everyone's tongue lately. Artificial intelligence is one of the most important technologies in the world today. It has become part of our lives and it affects everything we do. Apart from the science fiction fantasies and images of robots taking over the world, what could be the reason for all the excitement surrounding AI?
- 2 Al is a field of computer science that allows machines to imitate human thought processes and decision-making abilities. There are different types of Al and the most common form is called 'machine learning'. Machine learning involves training a computer program on a large amount of data so it can learn to identify patterns and make predictions based on that data. Al is also used in industries to help automate¹ tasks and improve efficiency.
- 3 Through the use of Al, individuals and groups enjoy a more personalised experience in various technological solutions. Al is used in a wide range of applications ranging from dating sites to online shopping. In Africa, it helps with solving important issues including access to healthcare, financial services and education. Overall, AI has the potential to revolutionise the way we live and work.
- The impact of AI on businesses is resulting in a shift in the type of skills needed to drive economic transformation. In the past four years, the use of Al across businesses has grown by 270 per cent. However, regardless of the 20 widespread anxiety about automation and machines displacing workers, Al is far from causing large-scale unemployment. It helps to simplify boring tasks and make workers more efficient. Besides making the workday less monotonous by removing all the redundant tasks, Al has lowered the entrylevel to some jobs, especially for people who had limited access to education.
- 5 As the world becomes increasingly technology-driven, it is exciting to see how Al transforms the way we work and create websites. With user-friendly tools and platforms, like WIX, it is now easier than ever to design and create professional-looking websites, even for people who do not have a background 30 in design. WIX, for example, offers a versatile platform that caters to users of all skill levels. Whether you are starting from scratch or working with templates, its artificial design intelligence (ADI) takes website design to the next level. You simply provide the ADI platform with basic information about your website needs and design preferences. ADI then creates a professional-looking website for you within minutes.

- A popular AI tool that is commonly used is ChatGPT. This is a natural language processing model that allows you to have human-like 'conversations' with a chatbot². ChatGPT can answer questions and assist with tasks like composing e-mails, writing essays and coding. It is popular among writers and people who work in advertising.

- Al is increasingly influencing our lives in many different ways, for example health, fashion and beauty. The TikTok³ bold glamour filter is a video beauty filter that makes the user look more attractive. This filter is blurring the boundaries between what is real and what is not through the use of Al technology. Unlike past social media filters, bold glamour does not malfunction when the face moves in a video. It uses a database of other faces to create a new airbrushed-looking face. The filter has received over 400 million views since its initial release.
- While AI is a powerful tool that can help us work faster and more efficiently, it is important to remember that it cannot replace human touch and creativity. 50 It is also worth noting that AI cannot be used to cheat the system and should not be used to cut corners. Instead, it should be used to improve existing systems, to make them more efficient and effective. Despite its limitations, AI is here to stay and it can help us keep up with the changes in technology. By embracing its potential and using it wisely, humans can reap the benefits 55 and work in ways they never previously thought possible.


