

PURPOSE, CONTENT AND GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

The purpose of this Project is to develop awareness on how the media contributes to either the building or derailment (hinder) of democracy in South Africa. The rights of innocent South African citizens are often violated and that threatens the objectives of the freedom of expression, among other rights, in the South African Constitution. Certain media consumers also violate other peoples' rights under the aegis of freedom of expression. Clearly, freedom of expression is often confused and gullible people do not know their rights. That ignorance and gullibility perpetuate the unsavory behavior. It is, thus, imperative that South Africans are schooled on their media freedom.
