There are several factors that contribute to the prevalence of cyberbullying in South Africa. One key factor is the widespread use of social media platforms, which provide an easy and anonymous way for bullies to target their victims. Additionally, a lack of awareness and education around cyberbullying prevention and intervention means that many young people are not equipped to handle online harassment.

According to a study by the University of J ohannesburg, factors such as peer pressure, jealousy, revenge, and boredom were cited as the most common reasons for cyberbullying among students. The same study found that victims of cyberbullying were often targeted due to their physical appearance, social status, or sexual orientation. These findings are consistent with other studies that have identified similar risk factors for cyberbullying, including low self-esteem, social isolation, and mental health issues. Addressing the root causes of cyberbullying in South Africa will require a multifaceted approach that includes education, awareness-raising, and support for victims.

South Africa has seen a surge in violence, cyberbullying by learners against peers, and online malicious acts against teachers. In response, the South African Department of Basic Education invited the social crime prevention police to intervene. This study reports on the developmental issues contributing to cyberbullying and the police response to this violence in rural schools.

An extensive literature review was conducted, and a *conceptual framework was developed to guide the study and development of a mobile application. This framework was tested using data collected from focus groups, 8 police officers, 9 teachers, 52 grade-10 learners, and 27 grade-12 learners. The data were analysed using *thematic and *quantitative techniques. The findings reveal some developmental issues. For instance, teachers are often targeted by learners online because they fail to take prompt action when learners report cyberbullying incidents.

This finding is consistent with the developmental theory which predicts that lack of support would create a permissive context for cyberbullying. In addition, the popularity of cyberbullying has a stronger influence on older, rather than younger, adolescents. Older adolescents are more concerned about gaining popularity than being socially accepted. Recommendations are made which can be useful to schools, learners, and the police force in their fight against cyberbullying.


