TEXT A

**‘THE HIDDEN DANGERS AND IMPACTS OF THE ZAMA ZAMAS:
SOUTH AFRICA’S ILLEGAL MINING CRISIS.’**

- 1 South Africa, a country rich in minerals and natural resources, has long been a global leader in mining. However, amid the official mining industry, a dangerous and unregulated practice has emerged. This dangerous venture involves miners, known as Zama Zamas, who are involved in illegal, informal mining activities. Zama Zamas which loosely translates to “try, try” in IsiZulu, reflects the perseverance and often desperation of individuals who engage in these risky ventures. Though they may seek economic opportunity, the consequences of their actions are fraught with danger, both for the miners themselves and for the broader society. 5
- 2 The rise of the Zama Zamas can be attributed to several factors. South Africa’s mining industry, once one of the largest and most prosperous in the world, has been in decline for decades. The country’s mining industry has also faced challenges like resource depletion, safety concerns, rising operational costs and change in global market prices. As major mining companies have abandoned and closed many of their old mines, this has left a vacuum that Zama Zamas are now filling. These miners often work in deep, dangerous shafts that are not maintained, posing significant risks to their lives. 10 15
- 3 Zama Zamas operate in dangerous conditions, often using rudimentary¹ tools to extract gold and other minerals. Many of them work in unused mines in and around Johannesburg, such as the famous “Crown Mines”, where abandoned tunnels are repurposed by these illegal miners. The work is physically demanding and hazardous, with high risk of accidents, such as drowning in flooded mines, due to unstable mine shafts and lack of safety equipment. Despite these risks, the potential for high financial rewards is a major draw, especially given the unemployment rate in South Africa, which remains one of the highest in the world. 20 25
- 4 The Zama Zama trade, however, is not without its problems. Due to the illegal nature of their operations, the miners often face the threats of arrests and exploitation. In addition, this practice has led to widespread of environmental damage. The extraction of minerals without proper regulation can result in contamination of water supply and soil degradation². Furthermore, the miners’ activities often result in land disputes with formal mining companies or local communities. 30



	The South African Minerals Council has estimated that illegal mining costs the formal mining sector billions of rands annually. In 2020, it was estimated that the sector loses around 21 billion each year due to illegal mining. According to the Mineral Resources Minister – Gwede Mantashe – over the past decade, more than 1000 Zama Zamas have lost their lives in mining-related accidents.	35 40
5	There is also a significant issue of violence among Zama Zama groups. Rival groups of illegal miners often engage in violent confrontations over territory and resources. These conflicts are sometimes fueled by criminal syndicates ³ who take advantage of lawlessness to smuggle minerals or extort money from miners. In some areas, Zama Zama are reported to have formed criminal gangs that control parts of the mining process, from extraction to smuggling and police and government authorities often struggle to maintain order.	45
6	In response to the growing problem, the South African government and law enforcement agencies have attempted various crackdowns on illegal mining. However, efforts have been largely ineffective due to the sheer scale of operation and the lack of resources to fully address the root causes of Zama Zama mining. To tackle the issue more effectively, many experts argue that a combination of stricter law enforcement, economic opportunities for local communities and sustainable mining practices are needed.	50 55
7	Getting rid of Zama Zamas will require a holistic and long-term approach that combines stricter law enforcement, economic development (by providing viable employment opportunities) and skills development programmes particularly in impoverished ⁴ and rural communities. Creation of regulated spaces where small-scale miners can work legally. Community engagement and education about the dangers of illegal mining, including health and environmental risk can help reduce illegal mining activities. The government can take steps to rehabilitate abandoned mining areas and reduce the environmental appeal of these locations for illegal miners. Through collaboration between the government, private sector and communities, there can be a sustainable solution that eliminates the need for illegal mining while improving safety, environmental health and economic prosperity	60 65

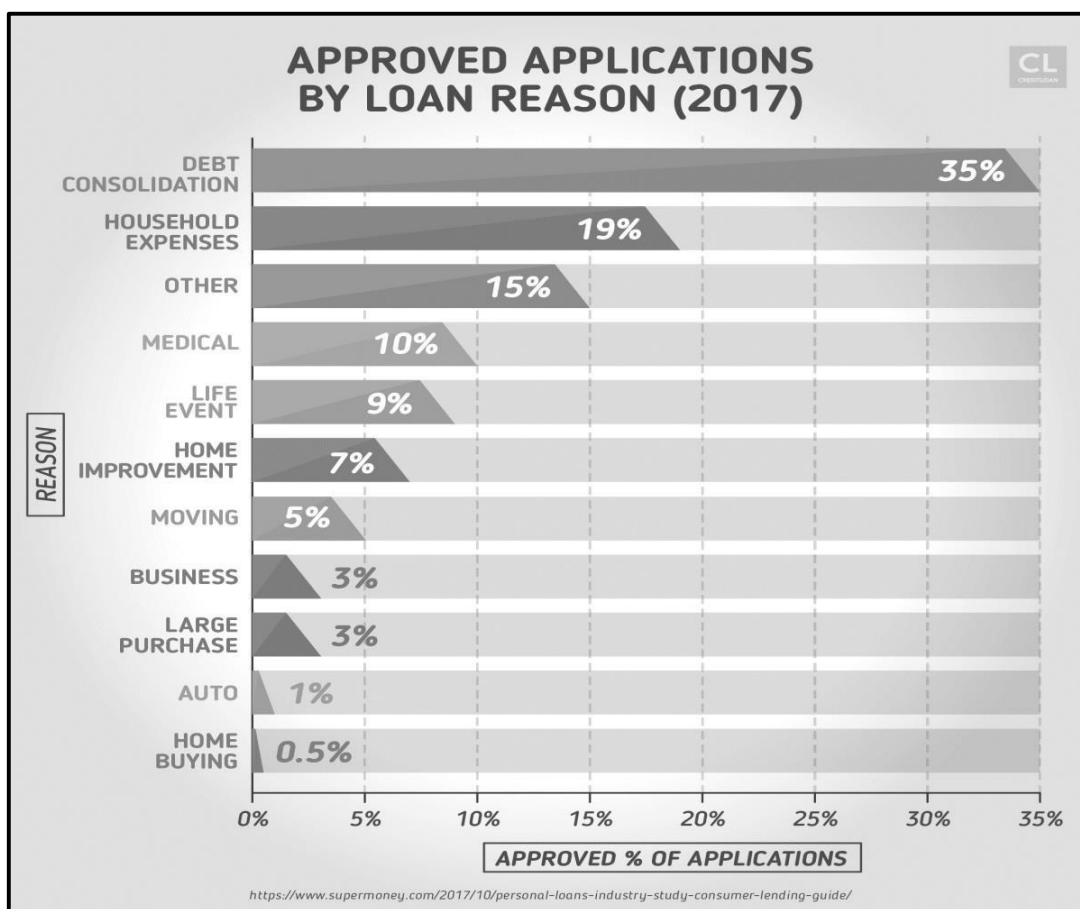

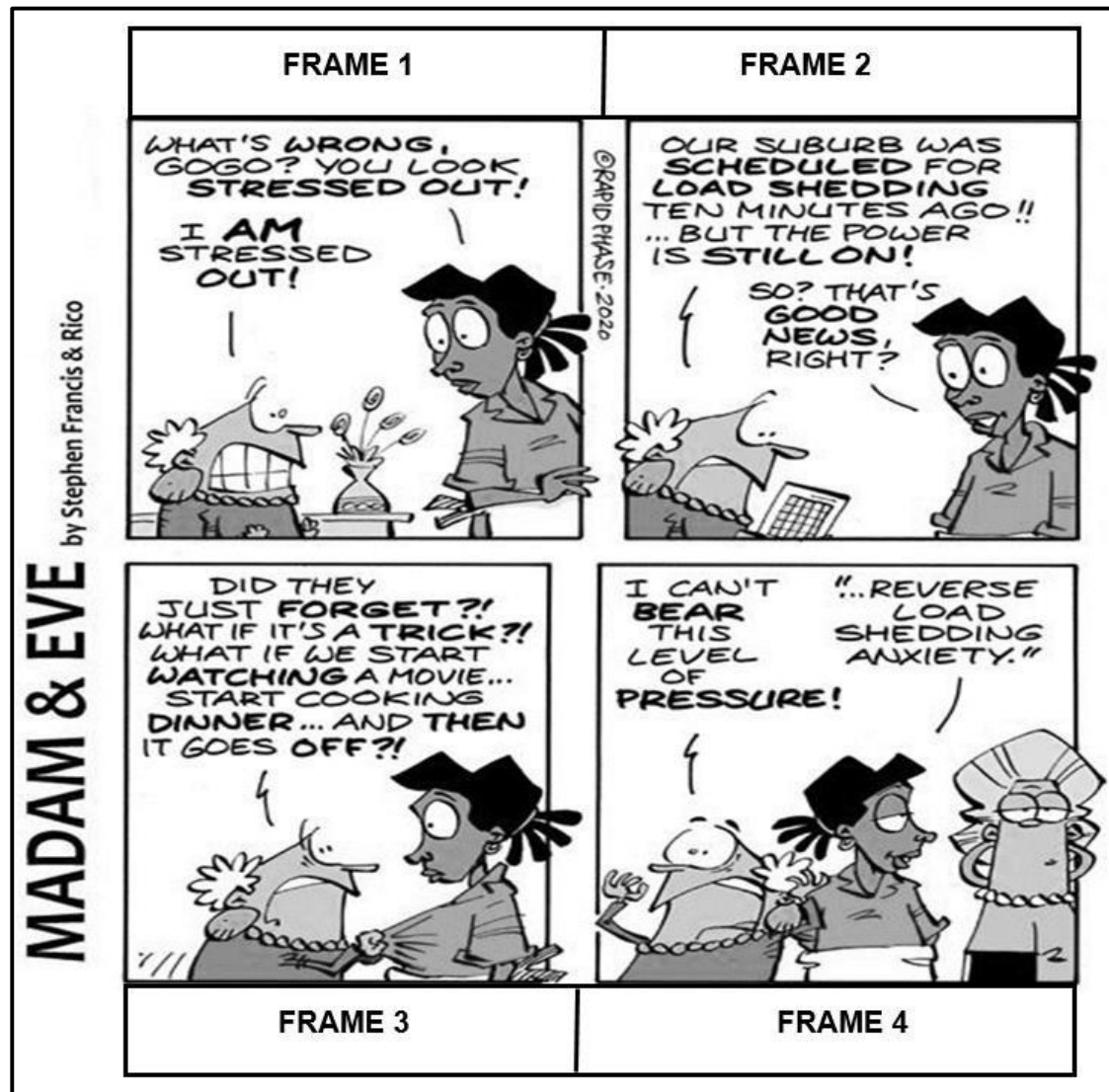

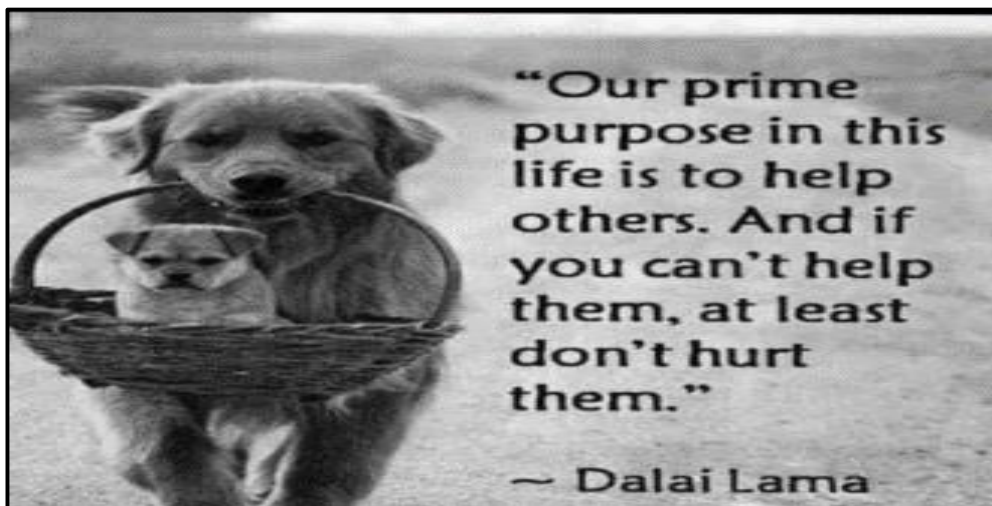
