QUESTION 1: WHY DID THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA GIVE FINANCIAL AID TO THE EUROPEAN COUNTRIES AFTER 1945?

Study Sources 1A, 1B, 1C and 1D and answer the questions that follow.

1.1 Use Source 1A.

- 1.1.1 Define the concept *containment* in your own words. (1 x 2) (2)
- 1.1.2 State THREE ways in the source that the United States of America could have used to implement the policy of containment. (3 x 1) (3)
- 1.1.3 Name the THREE decisions taken by the United States president subordinates after carefully calculating their priorities. (3 x 1) (3)
- 1.1.4 Using the information in the source and your own knowledge, explain how containment will benefit Western European nations in the late 1940s. (1 x 2) (2)

1.2 Refer to Source 1B.

- 1.2.1 List the TWO institutions that Dean Acheson helped to shape during Truman's Cold War. (2 x 1) (2)
- 1.2.2 Explain why you think the US Congress was initially unwilling to provide aid to the Turkish and Greek governments. (1 x 2) (2)
- 1.2.3 Who, according to the source, were called to a meeting by Truman in the hope of winning over the legislators? (2 x 1) (2)
- 1.2.4 Explain how Acheson managed to convince the US Congress to support both Turkey and Greece with aid. (2 x 2) (4)
- 1.2.5 Comment on what Acheson implied by the statement, "the crisis in South Eastern Europe was no local dust-up (small fight) but one that involved the two Cold War powers" in the context of adopting the Truman Doctrine in 1947. (1 x 2) (2)





1.3 Consult Source 1C.

- 1.3.1 Explain how, according to **Varga**, did the United States of America implement the Marshall Plan. (1 x 2) (2)
- 1.3.2 Quote **TWO pieces of evidence** from the source which indicate that the United States of America used the Marshall Plan to prevent an economic crisis. (2 x 1) (2)
- 1.3.3 Explain the concept *monopoly capital* in the context of the Marshall Plan. (1 x 2) (2)
- 1.3.4 Explain whether a historian would regard this source as reliable when researching the implementation of the Marshall Plan by the United States in 1947. (2 x 2) (4)

1.4 Study Source 1D.

- 1.4.1 Explain the messages conveyed in the cartoon regarding Europe's relationship with the United States of America during the Cold War. Use the visual clues in the source to support your answer. (2 x 2) (4)
- 1.4.2 Comment on why you think the face of the figure in the cartoon is depicted as a coin. (1 x 2) (2)

1.5 Study Sources 1C and 1D. Explain in which ways the evidence in these sources support each other regarding how the communists (soviets) viewed the Marshall Plan. (2 x 2) (4)

1.6 Using the information in the relevant sources and your own knowledge, write a paragraph of about EIGHT lines (about 80 words) explaining why the United States of America gave financial aid to European countries after 1945. (8) [50]





QUESTION 2 HOW DID FOREIGN POWERS BECOME INVOLVED IN THE COLD WAR IN ANGOLA FROM 1975?

Study Sources 2A, 2B, 2C and 2D and answer the questions that follow.

2.1 Refer to Source 2A.

- 2.1.1 Define the term *independence* in your own words. (1 x 2) (2)
- 2.1.2 Name **THREE** military movements in the source that fought for Angola's independence from colonial rule. (3 x 1) (3)
- 2.1.3 Give **TWO** provisions of the Alvor Agreement, as quoted from the source. (2 x 1) (2)
- 2.1.4 Explain the concept *civil war* in the context of the Cold War in Angola. (1 x 2) (2)
- 2.1.5 Using the information in the source and your own knowledge, explain what is implied by the phrase 'Angola developed into a Cold War battleground'. (2 x 2) (4)

2.2 Refer to Source 2B.

- 2.2.1 Name **TWO** countries that Vorster blamed for South Africa's intervention in Angola. (2 x 1) (2)
- 2.2.2 Why, according to Vorster, did South Africa become involved in the Cold War in Angola? (2 x 1) (2)
- 2.2.3 Comment on how the information given in paragraph 2 about South Africa's involvement in the Cold War in Angola goes against Vorster's statement in paragraph 1. (2 x 2) (4)
- 2.2.4 Identify **TWO** African leaders in the source that supported the decision by the South African Defence Force to assist the FNLA and UNITA. (2 x 1) (2)

2.3 Consult Source 2C.

- 2.3.1 Quote **ONE** item from the source that Cuba sent to the MPLA on 5 November 1975. (1 x 1) (1)
- 2.3.2 Using the information in the source and your own knowledge, explain how Castro viewed his relationship with the Soviet Union and the MPLA. (2 x 2) (4)
- 2.3.3 Comment on why you think Castro had a negative opinion of President Ford and Kissinger regarding Cuba's role in Angola. (1 x 2) (2)





2.4 Read Source 2D.

2.4.1 What messages do the cartoonist convey regarding the nature of foreign intervention in Angola? Use the visual clues in the source to support your answer. (2 x 2) (4)

2.4.2 Explain the limitations of the source to a historian researching the role of foreign intervention in Angola between 1975 and 1976. (2 x 2) (4)

2.5 Refer to Sources 2C and 2D. Explain how the information in Source 2C differs from the evidence in Source 2D regarding the role that the Soviet Union and Cuba played in Angola. (2 x 2) (4)

2.6 Using the information in the relevant sources and your own knowledge, write a paragraph of about EIGHT lines (about 80 words) explaining how foreign powers became involved in the Cold War in Angola from 1975. (8)

QUESTION 3: HOW DID THE BIRMINGHAM CAMPAIGNS CONTRIBUTE TO THE GRANTING OF CIVIL RIGHTS TO AFRICAN AMERICANS IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA IN THE 1960's?

Study Sources 3A, 3B, 3C and 3D and answer the questions that follow.

3.1 Use Source 3A.

- 3.1.1 Define the term *segregation* in your own words. (1 x 2) (2)
- 3.1.2 Quote TWO pieces of historical evidence from the source that suggest that Birmingham was a segregated city in the 1960s. (2 x 1) (2)
- 3.1.3 Why, according to Reverend Ellwanger, were most white Americans who lived in Birmingham in 1963 opposed to desegregation? (1 x 2) (2)
- 3.1.4 What evidence, according to the source, suggests that African Americans were under attack in Birmingham between 1953 and 1963? (1 x 2) (2)

3.2 Refer to Source 3B.

- 3.2.1 Give TWO reasons in the source why the initial campaign against segregation in Birmingham was unsuccessful. (2 x 1) (2)
- 3.2.2 What motivated Connor to change his tactics during the Birmingham Campaign? (1 x 2) (2)
- 3.2.3 Using the information in the source and your own knowledge, explain how the 'spectators' in the source responded to police action. (2 x 2) (4)
- 3.2.4 Explain in what ways did the media coverage of the Birmingham Campaign contribute to the success of the Civil Rights Movement in the United States of America in the 1960s. (2 x 2) (4)

3.3 Consult Source 3C.

- 3.3.1 Quote TWO pieces of evidence from the source which suggest that the civil rights activists were non-violent in their approach. (2 x 1) (2)
- 3.3.2 Explain the messages the cartoonist conveys regarding the Birmingham Campaign. Use the visual clues to support your answer. (2 x 2) (4)

- 3.4 Refer to Sources 3B and 3C. Explain how the information in Source 3B supports the visual evidence in Source 3C regarding the civil rights protest in Birmingham in 1963. (2 x 2) (4)





3.5 Study Source 3D.

3.5.1 Explain the concept *equal rights* in the context of the protest in Birmingham in 1963. (1 x 2) (2)

3.5.2 What, in Kennedy's opinion, was the main challenge that Americans faced in 1963? (1 x 2) (2)

3.5.3 Comment on why Kennedy believed that 'the time has come for this nation (America) to fulfil its promise' with regards to the struggle for civil rights for African Americans. (2 x 2) (4)

3.5.4 Comment on why a historian would find this source useful when studying the impact of the protest campaigns in Birmingham to the African Americans in the United States of America in the 1960s. (2 x 2) (4)

3.6 Using the information in the relevant sources and your own knowledge, write a paragraph of about EIGHT lines (about 80 words) to explain how the protest campaigns in Birmingham contributed to the granting of civil rights to African Americans in the United States of America in the 1960s. (8)
